## Captain Alfonzo, NAFEC's 35th Commanding Officer

El Centro's Navy Mayor to speak in October

In a change of command ceremony last February, Captain Brent "Fever" Alfonzo assumed command of Naval Air Facility El Centro as its 35th Commanding Officer.

We're looking forward to hearing about Captain Alfonzo's state of the NAFEC address, and hearing about his career path that led him to El Centro.

Captain Alfonzo grew up just a short distance from Imperial Valley. He is a native of Poway, California. He joined the Navy in August 1988, reporting to the Naval Academy Preparatory School. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the United States Naval Academy, and was commissioned as an ensign upon his graduation with the class of 1993. He reported to NAS Pensacola, Florida for primary and helicopter

flight training, and was winged as a naval aviator in November 1995. He earned a Master's Degree in Global Leadership from the University of San Diego in April 2001.

Alfonzo's operational assignments include Helicopter Antisubmarine Squadron (HS) 4 "Black Knights" with an embark aboard USS Abraham Lincoln (CVN 72); Carrier Air Wing (CVW) 14 as Helicopter Operations Officer and Seahawk Weapons and Tactics Instructor; a return to HS-4 as operations department head, and HS-6 "Indians" as executive officer with follow on assignment as commanding officer. During this tour, the Indians completed a successful deployment in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, and transitioned from HS-6 to Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 6, upgrading the squadron to the highly capable MH-60S Seahawk helicopter. He has accumulated 4,400 flight hours in his flying career.

Alfonzo's shore and staff assignments include HS-10 "Warhawks" as fleet replacement squadron instructor, and with the Joint Chiefs of Staff Operations Directorate in the National Military Command Center. In addition, he served as Rotary Wing Weapons School Department Head at Naval Strike and Air Warfare Center, NAS Fallon, Nevada, and as WTI Program Director at Naval Mine and Anti-Submarine Warfare Command and Naval Surface and Mine Warfighting Development Center.

## Gold Star Mother's and Family Day

Gold Star Family Program highlighted at September Dinner

In case you missed it, at our September dinner, we hosted Sabrina Griffin, Navy Region Southwest's Regional Coordinator who told us more about the Gold Star program.

Since 1936, the last Sunday in September has been designated as Gold Star Mother's Day to recognize and honor those who have lost a child while serving our country in the United States Armed Forces.

In 2009, fallen service members' families were officially recognized and added by presidential proclamation, renaming the observance to Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day.

Members of the Armed Forces don't serve alone. Standing with each service member are parents, spouses, children and siblings providing support and love. This year when the president signs the proclamation observ-

## **GAO: Naval Shipyards, Poor Conditions that Affect Operations**

#### Government Accountability Office Issues Report

Our Shipyards are in trouble. The GAO released another troubling report last week, focused on the state of our public shipyards, and it was very concerning. The report showis the need to invest in shipyard infrastructure projects and how these issues at shipyards are impacting the Navy's readiness.

- · Backlogged maintenance and restoration projects for the facilities have grown by 41 percent over the past five years
- · Fixing them will cost roughly \$4.86 billion and won't be completed for nearly 20 years.
- · A Navy analysis found that shipyard capital equipment has an average age that now exceeds its expected useful life.
- · Inadequate facilities and equipment have led to maintenance delays that contributed to more than 1,300 lost operational days for carriers and 12,500 lost operational days for submarines from fiscal year 2000 to 2016, the report states.
- · As a result of the ongoing problems, the Navy will be unable to conduct more than a third of its 218 planned maintenance periods over the next 23 fiscal years.
- · The report found that the average age of the 18 drydocks used to perform maintenance is about 89 years, with the oldest completed in 1891 and the newest completed in 1962.
- · Several dry docks can't support existing boat classes, while others can only support vessels when assisted by equipment or tidal schedules.

The Navy League is on Capitol Hill, constantly supporting forums, speakers, and other events to help tell the sea services story. But that pales in comparison to the power you have as a constituent. Make your voice heard. Tell your Member of Congress and your Senators you support the sea services by taking action on one of our legislative initiatives. 


October is here, which means the holidays will be upon us in no time at all. Though it's difficult to think about holiday gatherings when then temperature is still hovering around triple digits, we must.

## The Two Navy Holidays: Navy Birthday and Navy Day

Navy League originally sponsored Navy Day beginning in 1922

The Navy Birthday is one of the two Navy-wide dates celebrated annually – Navy Birthday and Navy Day.

The United States Navy was originally established as the Continental navy on 13 October 1775, when the Continental Congress authorized the procurement, fitting out, manning, and dispatch of two armed vessels to cruise in search of munitions ships supplying the British Army in America. The legislation also established a Naval Committee to supervise the work. All together, the Continental Navy numbered some fifty ships over the course of the war, with approximately twenty warships active at its maximum strength.

Navy Day was originally sponsored by the Navy League 1922. Navy Day is designed to give recognition to the naval service. The Navy League of New York proposed that the official observance be on 27 October in honor of President Theodore Roosevelt, who had been born on that day.

In 1972 Chief of Naval Operations (CNO) Admiral Elmo R. Zumwalt authorized recognition of 13 October as the Navy's birthday. In contrast to Navy Day, the Navy Birthday is intended as an internal activity for members of the active forces and reserves, as well as retirees, and dependents. Since 1972 each CNO has encouraged a Navy-wide celebration of this occasion "to enhance a greater appreciation

of our Navy heritage, and to provide a positive influence toward pride and professionalism in the naval service." (Military Times)


